Atholic Missions in Canada was founded in 1908 under papal mandate and has been supporting the hard work of the missionaries in remote and poor mission communities across Canada since then. Catholic Missions in Canada seeks to sustain and extend the Catholic faith in isolated, poor and hardto-reach mission areas. These are communities where diocesan resources are insufficient to keep the church alive which is why the Catholic Missions of Canada are indispensable when it comes to fostering faith. Not only do they provide essential social services they also promote social justice, preserve religious traditions and build bridges between diverse cultural groups. Missions contribute significantly to the spiritual and social fabric of Canada and as the Church continues to navigate the challenges of modern society, Catholic missions will remain a crucial source of hope, service and inspiration for man Canadians. According to the Catholic Missions website, sixty-eight percent of all donations go towards sustaining missionaries, eleven percent goes towards seminarian education, nine percent for repairs to maintain mission churches, nine percent champions religious educational programs and three percent for lay leaders. Even though they are credited they know that they could not do it alone which is why Catholic Missions constantly expresses gratitude for the loyal base of donors and their partnerships with organizations such as the Catholic Women's League, Catholic school boards and the Knights of Columbus who make it all possible. I am writing this on behalf of the Anemki - Wadj Spiritual Centre to express our deepest gratitude for the on -going financial support we have received from missions Canada. Missions Canada's commitment has been the cornerstone in our mission to serve the community and foster spiritual growth.

Thanks to their support, we have successfully hosted numerous enriching initiatives such as private retreats, cultural days including honoring our ancestors and blessing of the bundles in collaboration with Saint Ann's R.C. church St. Kateri Tekakwitha Church. These events have been instrumental in building bridges within both the indigenous and Catholic Church, communities promoting education and celebrating their rich traditions of peoples. The integration of these ceremonies within the Catholic Church has brought healing dignity and a deeper understanding to all involved.

This sponsorship has also played a vital role in the success of the spiritual exercises of Saint Ignatius. Each year we have witnessed 6 - 12 individuals completing this transformative program which ultimately aids in discerning their own call within the church. The impact of these exercises has been profound and life changing for many. For the year 2023 and 2024 we have two groups coming through the exercises. One group consisting of eight people and the second group consisting of seven people.

Furthermore, our centre has become a beacon of learning and interaction for university students from Toronto Ontario focusing on studies and interaction with the land. We have also been able to host a variety of retreats in partnership with both school boards public and Catholic, the Ontario Native Women's Association, (ONWA), the Catholic Women's League (CWL), Christian Life Community in collaboration with the Jesuits, and was able to provide a serene environment for priests during their eight-day silent retreats. Over the past few years, we have been able to develop a Spiritual Director's Workshop working in collaboration with the Pickering Manresa Spiritual Centre. Fr. Henk S.J. has generously provided an entrance level workshop that has helped develop a deeper level of service in ministry in our church and community. It has been well received here in Thunder Bay with the first participants receiving their certificates from Bishop Colli at the end of 2022. We have since began a new program with approximately 22 participants. This Spiritual Director's Program will be from 2023-2025. Again with Fr. Henk facilitating from Pickering. We are truly blessed. The breadth of our reach, considering the size of our centre, is a testament to the power of community and shared faith.

The support of Missions Canada has been a crucial element in our ability to serve not just our local community in Thunder Bay, but also to extend our reach and impact. We are deeply grateful for their generosity, which has enabled us to continue our vital work. Their contributions have not only supported our endeavors but have also been a source of encouragement and hope.

As we look forward to the future, we are filled with optimism and gratitude.

Diocesan Ministries in Our Parish

Education

Adult Faith Office: \$50,000

Provides support for liturgical ministries and the resource library at the Pastoral Centre that offers a wide variety of religious materials for workshops, conferences, study programs and sacramental preparation programs for children and adults. The office also offers a variety of books, videos, and articles on religious issues for personal study and gifts, through the All Seasons Gift Shop.

Office of Worship: \$10,000

Encourages liturgical understanding through programs designed to enhance the quality of religious celebrations in the diocese and supports the Office of Worship committee meetings and our Diocesan celebrations.

Indigenous Ministries Office and

Anemki-Wadj Anameogamik Retreat Centre: \$20,000 Supports and encourages a close relationship between the Diocese and our First Nation parishes, the Anemki-Wadj Anameogamik Retreat Centre, Indigenous activities, and to help foster responses to the Truth and Reconciliation Report.

Youth

Youth Ministry: \$15,000

Provides training for youth leaders, retreats for youth and resources for such programs as NET, Salt and Light retreats, and parish youth programs, the Catholic Club at Lakehead University and Catholic Christian Outreach programs.

Social Services

Diocesan Marriage Tribunal: \$20,000

Provides help to those who need to reconcile their marriage with the Church through the annulment process.

Refugee Settlement: \$20,000

Through the operation of the D.O.O.R.S. office the Diocese assists needy immigrants with clothing, housing, medical needs and their relations with the Government of Canada.

Catholic Support Programs: \$45,000

Financial support is given to organizations such as the Dew Drop Inn, Catholic Action Centre, Mission to Seafarers, Serena, Cursillio, Charis, etc.

Diocesan Aid: \$60,000

Supports financially missions and smaller churches and their clergy operating in remote areas of the Diocese where unemployment is high and parish numbers and collections are low.

Social Communications: \$20,000

Provides support for the Thunder Bay Street Gospel program, Internet needs, the Diocesan Newsletter, and Masses on YouTube.

Truth and Healing Ministries

Truth and Healing Ministries:

(Noojimo'iwewin ne'en da'ing - Healing of the Hearts) \$50,000 In union with all of the Catholic Churches in Canada, these funds will be used for special projects of healing and reconciliation with our Indigenous peoples in the Diocese of Thunder Bay. These funds will be used in the Diocese of Thunder Bay and in consultation and with the approval of the bishop and our Elders Committee.

Clergy

Vocations: \$5,000

Promotes vocations to the priesthood and the permanent diaconate in the Diocese of Thunder Bay.

Permanent Diaconate Program and

Ongoing Education for Permanent Deacons: \$25,000 Provides formation programs that continue to educate our deacons and ministers of service in their ministry.

Ongoing Education of Priests: \$25,000

Provides workshops, retreats and training programs for priests in the Diocese along with the Chrism Mass meeting.

Priests' Infirm Fund: \$50,000

Assists three retired priests and one retired bishop with retirement support.

Priests' Pension Fund: \$20,000

Supplements the pension fund of our priests for their future retirement needs.
