****Saint of the Day - May 26, 2025**** St. Philip Neri: Began his ministry to the street people of Rome as a layman, working with toughs, starving artists and poor store keepers to help them improve themselves materially and spirituality. He finally sought ordination only when convinced by his confessor that it would make him more effective in serving those to whom he ministered. "A servant of God ought always to be happy," he said and his unfailing good nature and joyful spirit soon drew others to assist him in serving the poor.
